(A) PFS after the radiotherapy of patients who received radiotherapy according to resection. The blue line represents patients who did not undergo surgical resection; the yellow line represents patients who underwent surgical resection. Tumor resection in these patients was not associated with prolonged PFS (median PFS of 8.6 months [95% CI, 8.5 to NA] for patients who underwent resection vs. 12.2 months [95% CI, 7.3 to NA] for patients did not undergo resection; p=0.26). (B) The OS from diagnosis of patients who received radiotherapy according to resection. The blue line represents patients who did not undergo surgical resection; the yellow line represents patients who underwent surgical resection. Tumor resection in these patients was not associated with prolonged OS (median OS, 21.8 months [95% CI, 13.2 to NA] for resected patients vs. 24.9 months [95% CI, 18.2 to NA] for unresected patients; p=0.61). (C) PFS after radiotherapy of patients who received surgical resection followed by radiotherapy according to GTR achievement. The blue line represents patients who did not achieve GTR; the yellow line represents patients who achieved GTR. GTR was not associated with prolonged PFS in these patients who underwent resection (median PFS: 6.8 months [95% CI, 2.9 to NA] for GTR-achieved patients vs. 9.7 months [95% CI, 8.5 to NA] for GTR-unachieved patients; p=0.64).
